The Event will be held under the FIA International Sporting Code including Appendices and the National Competition Rules of Motorsport Australia, the Speed Event Standing Regulations, Autocross Standing Regulations, these Supplementary Regulations and any Further Regulations, Bulletins or instructions issued by the Organisers.

This Event will be conducted under and in accordance with Motorsport Australia OH&S, Motorsport Australia Safety 1st and Risk Management Policies, which can be found on the Motorsport Australia website at www.motorsport.org.au

This event will be conducted under and in accordance with any or all the current Motorsport Australia COVID-19 Return to Race strategy requirements at the time of this event.

2 EVENT DESCRIPTION:

The event will be a **Come and Try** conducted on a flat, smooth, unsealed track approximately one kilometer in length. The course does not contain jumps or mud holes. The event will be held at Willowbank Park, Champions Way, Willowbank on Sunday 17th January 2021.

- (b) The Start Official (his/her assistants where applicable) shall be deemed Judges of Fact in respect to: -
- Starting Grid procedures and false starts.
- Finish line procedures and order of finish and penalties applied.
- (c) The Clerk of the Course and Official Observers shall be deemed Judges of Fact in respect to: -
- Speeding in the pit area, disobeying the flags and any other rules.

Competitors are reminded that there is no right to protest against the decision of a Judge of Fact.

8 ENTRIES

Entries open with the issue of these Regulations and close at 5pm on Saturday 16th January 2021 Entries are preferred to be done online electronically through the Club Web page. All entrants will sign an indemnity form.

The event may be limited to 50 starters. Any entry not accepted will be refunded in full. The organizers reserve the right to refuse any entry without assigning any reason therefore in accordance with the provisions of NCR 33.

No responsibility will be taken for entries not forwarded or handed to the Event Secretary

Maximum of 3 (three) people from same household, no cleaning required.

Maximum of 2 (two) drivers (not same household) per car will be accepted providing the vehicle is wiped on all touched surfaces with sanitizer wipes between each driver.

The Event may be limited to 50 starters. Any Entry not accepted will be refunded in full.

9 PARENTAL CONSENT:

If any entrant, driver, or pit crew is under 18 years of age, the consent of his/her parent or guardian must appear on the Entry Form.

10 PERSONS ELIGIBLE:

The event shall be open only to persons over 14 years of age who have either a Motorsport Australia Level 2 Speed Licence or higher or obtain a Motorsport Australia Introductory Licence.

11 SCRUTINY:

Scrutiny will be held at the scrutiny pad, Willowbank Park, from 8.00am.

All vehicles will be scrutineered prior to participating, or at the discression of the Chief Scrutineer. Only authorized vehicles may practice.

ALL VEHICLES MUST COMPLY WITH SECTIONS A & B OF THE CURRENT MOTORSPORT AUSTRALIA MANUAL TO COMPETE AT THIS EVENT.

Documents: The following documents must be presented at scrutiny.

Current Motorsport Australia Competition Speed Licence level 2 speed or greater, or An Introductory Licence

Current Motorsport Australia affiliated car club Membership Card, where applicable

Motorsport Australia Vehicle Logbook (where issued)

Vehicles having current registration in Queensland under the "Transport Operations (Road

Use Management—Vehicle Registration) Regulation 1999" require a -

Compulsory Third-Party Insurance (CTPI) extension valid for this event.

Apparel, including helmets, and footwear must be produced at scrutiny and on request during the meeting.

12 **DRIVERS' BRIEFING:**

A compulsory Drivers' Briefing will be held at the club house at 9am.

13 STARTING ORDER

Starting order will be at the discretion of the Clerk of the Course.

14 PRACTICE:

There will be NO driving tuition given.

15 INSURANCE:

Certain public, property, professional indemnity and personal accident insurance is provided by Motorsport Australia in relation to the Event. Further details can be found in the Motorsport Australia Insurance Handbook, available at www.motorsport.org.au.

16 **TIMING: No time will be used**

17 PENALTIES there will be no penalties

18 **PROTESTS: there will be no protests**

19 **ABANDONMENT:**

The organizers reserve the right to abandon, cancel, postpone, terminate, or alter the event in accordance With NCR 11 and may cancel the event if fewer than 30 entries are received.

20 ALCOHOL, DRUGS AND OTHER SUBSTANCES

Any holder of a Motorsport Australia Competition' or 'Officials' license (or equivalent license issued by another ASN) may be tested for the presence of drugs (or other banned substances) and subject to a penalty(ies) for a breach in accordance with the Motorsport Australia anti-Doping Policy and/or the Motorsport Australia Illicit Drugs in Sport (Safety Testing) Policy as published on the Motorsport Australia website. Consumption of alcohol in the paddock, pits, or any section of the competition venue/course under the control of the Officials is forbidden until all competition is concluded each day. Accordingly, any holder of a Motorsport Australia 'Competition' or 'Officials' license (or equivalent license issued by another ASN) may also be tested for the presence of alcohol by a Motorsport Australia Accredited Testing Official (CATO) in accordance with the Motorsport Australia Standard Operating Procedure for Breath Alcohol Testing.

21 VEHICLE CATEGORIES - CLASSES:

Class A. Production vehicles up to 1600cc

Class B. Production vehicles 1601cc to 2000cc

Class C. Production vehicles 2001cc to 3000cc

Class D. Production vehicles over 3000cc

Class E. Four-wheel drive vehicles & specials of all capacities

Junior class defined between age 14 -17 years. No 4wd, no Turbo or Supercharged cars only up to 2ltrs. Junior A is Where a Junior, drives a car greater than 2ltrs. (No 4wd, no Turbo or Supercharged Cars) Ladies open class

Entries will be accepted at the discretion of the organizers and subject to the provisions of the Track License. Small number of entries in any class may lead to amalgamation at the discretion of the organizers.

DETERMINATION OF WINNERS:

No winners.

24 APPAREL:

Drivers must wear apparel complying with Schedule D of the current Motorsport Australia Manual during practice and the event:

A helmet that complies with AS1698 and carries marking to that effect; or be otherwise specifically approved by Motorsport Australia, also appropriately marked to that effect.

Non-flammable clothing, including cover from ankles to wrist to throat. No person will be permitted to compete wearing apparel of nylon or similar material. Refer Schedule D of the current Motorsport Australia Manual.

Suitable footwear.

Prohibited are for example - thongs, roman sandals and high-heeled shoes, nylon joggers. Goggles or visors with lens other than glass (to AS1609) in open cars.

25 SAFETY - CARS:

The attention of participants is drawn to Schedules A and B of the General Requirements of Automobiles found in the Motorsport Australia Manual. The following should be specially noted: All cars must be fitted with:

- Seat Belts of a type specifically in Schedule I of the current Motorsport Australia Manual, and a minimum of lap sash for road registered vehicles.
- A fire extinguisher (securely fitted), which complies with AS1841 (except AS 1841.2) (See Schedule H of the current Motorsport Australia Manual). Fire extinguishers shall be maintained in accordance with Australian Standards 1851 Part 1.
- All vehicles must be fitted with D.O.T. (Aust) approved tyres, however not included in allowable tyres are any form of rally tyre (D.O.T. approved or not) winter tread, grooved, re-treaded, speedway, spiked or knobby treads of any sort.

• The Chief Scrutineer is the Judge of Fact as previously stated at

Should further clarification on tyres be required prior to the Event.

It is recommended that contact be made with the Chief Scrutineer before the close of entries.

- Advertising is allowed on vehicles, subject to NCR 62.
- Cars must have on their coachwork a blue triangle of 150mm sides which indicates the location of the battery or master switch.
- All headlights must be adequately masked. which complies with (see Schedule B of the current Motorsport Australia Manual

25 GENERAL:

- a) Tubeless tyres must be fitted only to the optimum rim size.
- b) Fuel must be 'Commercial Fuel' as defined by Motorsport Australia (Schedule G of the current Motorsport Australia Manual). Competitors must supply their own fuel.
- c) Roll bars are not required, but it is strongly recommended that they be used in open cars.
- Road registered cars do not require oil catch tanks, tail shaft straps, wired drain plugs, and scatter shields.
- e) Competitor's permanent racing numbers will be used where possible. Competitors must use the number shown on the official list of entries; numbers must be shown on each side of car.
- f) The organisers reserve the right to reject any vehicle that is not presented in a clean and tidy condition.
- g) A speed limit of 10 kph must be maintained in the pits and paddock area.
- h) Drivers must obey all flag signals and instructions by officials while on the course.
- i) Cars must not record sound levels in excess of 95 dB measured 30m from the track edge at any time.
- j) To assist with Class identification, we are introducing a sticker to be placed in the top left corner of the windscreen. (Sticker to be approx. 150mm x 150mm Black on white. E.g., A-E, J & L)

26 COMPLIANCE WITH INSTRUCTION:

Failure to follow the direction of any Official / Marshall may render a participant liable to exclusion from the Meeting.

27 LOCATION DETAILS

From Ipswich to Willowbank, travel along the Cunningham Highway towards Warwick past Amberley. Travel 4.8 km's after the Amberley-Rosewood intersection than turn right into Champions Way. Travel 1 km than turn left into 'Willowbank Park' the Ipswich West Moreton Auto Club grounds.
